

Local Law No. 6 of the year 2017

A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Thompson

1. Legislative Intent. It is the intent of this local law to allow the Town of Thompson to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.
2. Authority. This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.
3. Tax Levy Limit Override. The Town Board of the Town of Thompson, County of Sullivan, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.
4. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and the remainder of this local law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
5. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

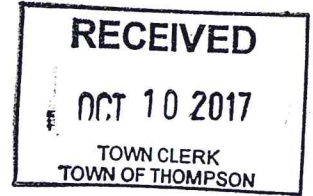

INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW
MORATORIUM ON LARGE-SCALE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that there has been introduced before the Town Board of the Town of Mamakating, New York, on October 3, 2017, a local law titled "Moratorium on Large-Scale Solar Energy Systems," which local law would provide that for a period of four (4) months, no Town board, officer or employee shall approve an application for development of a large-scale solar energy system (solar farm), except, however, if a complete application for approval of a large-scale solar energy system was submitted to the Planning Board and a public hearing was commenced on the application prior to adoption of this local law, review of that application shall continue and the Planning Board's determination on the application shall be made pursuant to the zoning regulations currently in effect. The introductory local law contains a procedure for applicants to seek administrative relief from the moratorium. A complete copy of the Introductory Local Law is available for inspection at the Town Clerk's Office.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, the Town Board of the Town of Mamakating, New York, will hold a public hearing on the aforesaid Local Law at the Town Hall, 2948 Route 209, Wurtsboro, New York, on October 17, 2017, at 6:00 P.M., at which time all persons interested therein shall be heard.

The Town of Mamakating will make every effort to assure that the hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. Anyone requiring special assistance and/or reasonable accommodations should contact the Town Clerk.

Dear Supervisor Rieber and Board Members,

As you are aware, in 2017 lawmakers in Albany adopted legislation affecting all Counties within New York State known as the "Countywide Shared Services Property Tax Savings Plan Law." The intended purpose of the law is to further help offset costs to taxpayers through local governmental collaboration. Following the adoption of this legislation, County Manager Joshua Potosek convened the Sullivan County Shared Services Panel. The panel, comprised of municipal leaders throughout Sullivan County, dedicated significant hours of research and collaboration to identify opportunities to reduce costs while maintaining the best possible services to our taxpayers.

One example of shared municipal services, aggregated purchase of electricity, has been a very helpful way for municipalities to save tax dollars. Under the state legislation, municipalities that currently do not participate in an aggregated purchase program, such as the Municipal Electric and Gas Alliance (MEGA) electricity procurement, could capture these savings in the Shared Services Plan.

I am reaching out at this time to encourage you to give consideration to participating in an aggregated electricity purchase program, and evaluate the potential benefits that it could offer to your municipality and taxpayers. The MEGA electricity procurement program will provide an offer for electricity pricing at no cost or obligation to your municipality.

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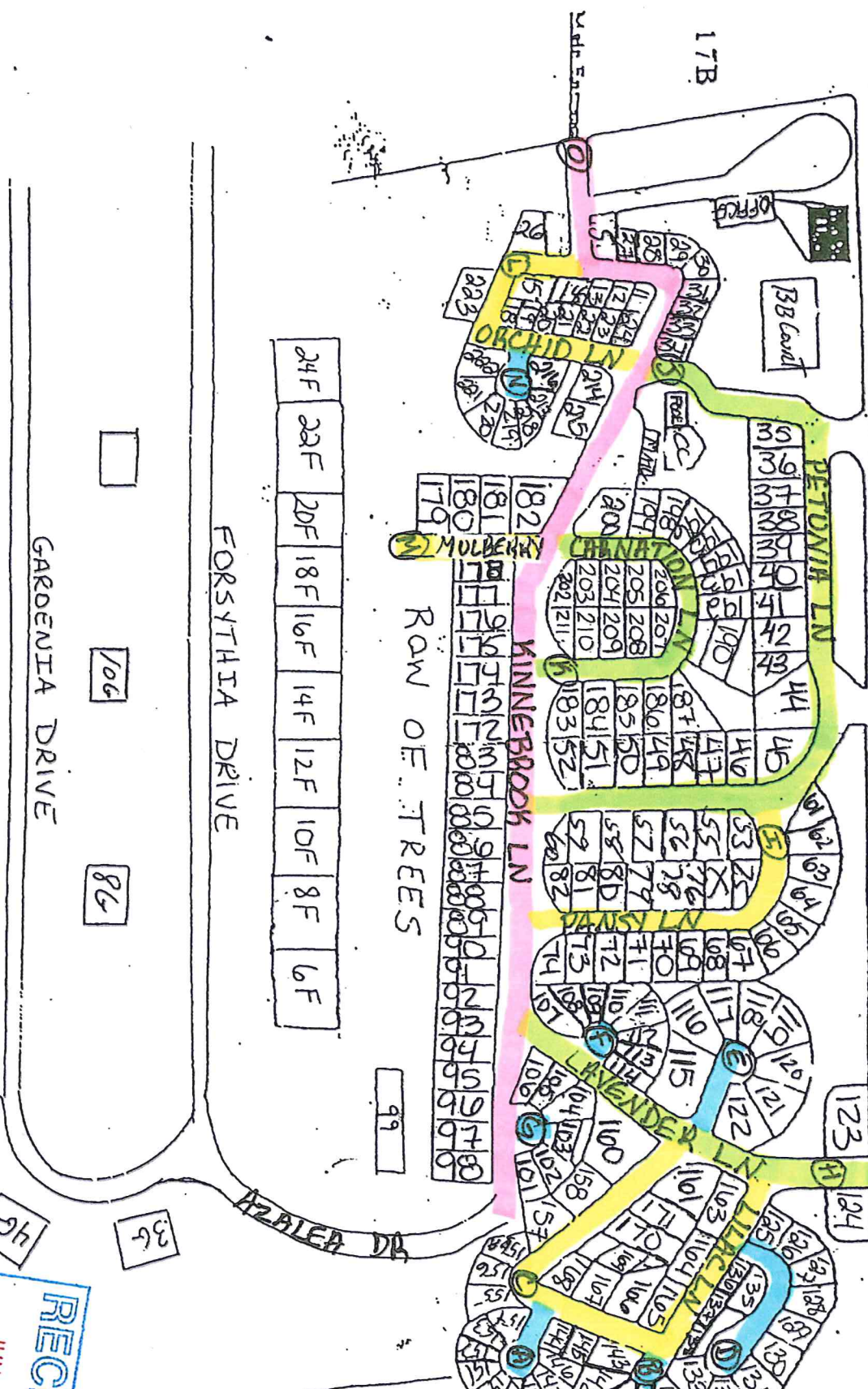

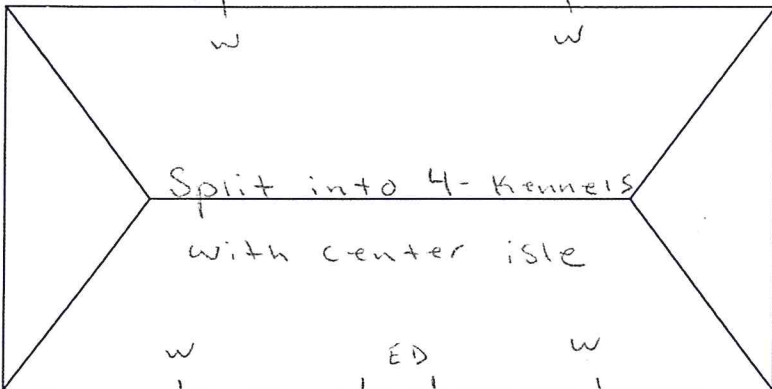

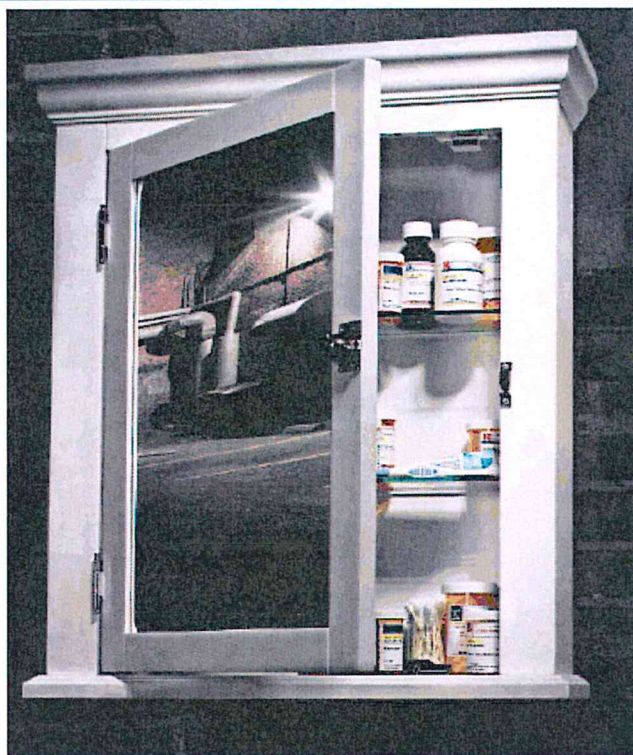
