
BUDGET WORK-SESSION

PUBLIC HEARING: PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #8 OF 2016 – TAX LEVY LIMIT OVERRIDE

Supervisor Rieber opened the Public Hearing at 7:30 PM.

Town Clerk, Marilee J. Calhoun read the legal public notice and stated that she had an original affidavit of publication. Notice of said hearing was duly published in the Sullivan County Democrat on October 11, 2016 with same being posted at the Town Hall on October 07, 2016.

Supervisor Rieber explained the purpose for this public hearing, which is to override the tax levy limit of two-percent (2%). This law is being approved as a precaution in the event that the budget comes in over the required tax levy limit upon the auditor's recommendation. The Town does not expect to exceed the tax levy limit, however if there are calculation errors or chargebacks beyond our control then the tax levy limit could be exceeded and the Town would then be in violation.

Supervisor Rieber asked if the Town Board and anyone from the public would like to be heard on this matter. There was no public comment.

After an opportunity for all persons to be heard Supervisor Rieber entertained a motion that the public hearing be closed.

A motion to close the Public Hearing at 7:33 PM was made by Councilman Briggs and seconded by Councilman Pavese.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Kevin McCague of Cimarron Road, Monticello expressed complaint regarding drainage, road surface issues and U-turns occurring near his property as a result of the Interchange 106 and Casino entrance project. Supt. Benjamin was out to inspect the area of concern, which he briefly reported on. He will see what can be done to address the road surface issue and will take care of any drainage issues if they arise as necessary. Once the project has been completed the drainage issues should resolve. As for the U-turn issue he is not sure if anything can be done at this time to eliminate the problem, however it should become less of a problem once the road signs have been posted. WHEREAS, proposed Local Law No. 08 of the year 2016 entitled, "A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c" was introduced to the Town Board at a meeting held October 04, 2016, at the Town Hall, Monticello, New York, to consider said proposed local law and notice of public hearing having been duly published and posted as required by law, and said public hearing having been held and all persons appearing at said public hearing deeming to be heard having been heard, and

WHEREAS, said local law was duly adopted after a public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Thompson, New York, does hereby enact and adopt Local Law No. 07 for the year 2016, Town of Thompson, State of New York, which local law is annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

Local Law No. 07 of the year 2016

A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Thompson

1. Legislative Intent. It is the intent of this local law to allow the Town of Thompson to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.
2. Authority. This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.
3. Tax Levy Limit Override. The Town Board of the Town of Thompson, County of Sullivan, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.
4. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and the remainder of this local law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
5. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

**2. ESTABLISH DATE FOR JOINT PUBLIC HEARING WITH VILLAGE –
ANNEXATION PETITION: COUNTY OF SULLIVAN, SBL #'S 12.-1-37.7 & 43
(NOVEMBER 15TH, 2016 @ 6:45PM)**

County of Sullivan, Petitioner and Property Owner of vacant property located along Old Route 17, Monticello, New York, SBL #'s 12.-1-37.7 & 12.-1-43 filed a Petition with the Town Clerk for Annexation into the Village of Monticello for the purpose of property development of a new County Jail and related facilities. The Town Clerk contacted the Village Clerk to coordinate a date to schedule a Joint Public Hearing. Town Clerk Calhoun is recommending that a Joint Public Hearing be scheduled with the Village to be held at the Village Hall on Tuesday, November 15th, 2016 at 6:45 PM.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

- Proposed Local Law to Amend Chapters 52 & 250 Re: Establishment of Recreation Fees, which was sent to the Planning Board for review and recommendation. Further discussion was held regarding the subject.

TAX CERTIORARI SETTLEMENT – MARY LOU MULLER, KATRINA FALLS ROAD, ROCK HILL, SBL # 51A.-1-25, YEAR 2016

Attorney Mednick presented a Resolution on the above named property tax settlement proceeding being presented. Attorney Mednick and Assessor Van B. Krzywicki recommended that the settlement be approved as per the provided Resolution. Attorney Mednick explained the settlement agreement. The Town Board took action on the settlement as follows:

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF A PROCEEDING
INSTITUTED UNDER ARTICLE 7 OF THE REAL PROPERTY TAX
LAW AGAINST THE TOWN OF THOMPSON**

WHEREAS, Mary Lou Muller has instituted proceedings under Article 7 of the Real Property Tax Law to review the assessment of Tax Map Parcel Section 51A, Block 1, Lot 25 and which proceeding is pending in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of Sullivan, under Index No. 1216-2016; and

WHEREAS, the parties have appeared through counsel, to wit, Michael B. Mednick, Esq. on behalf of respondents, and Michael D. Altman, Esq. on behalf of petitioner; and

WHEREAS, negotiations by and between the parties hereto have produced a proposed settlement of the issues and matters in dispute, and

WHEREAS, a previous offer to reduce petitioner's assessment from \$166,300.00 to \$92,400.00 was rescinded by the Board of Assessment Review, however, the lowered assessment was inadvertently entered on the 2016 Final Roll; and

WHEREAS, the proposed settlement will also result in a fair and equitable resolution of the complaint with respect to petitioner's 2016 assessment going forward, to wit, a correction in the assessment of petitioner's real property, **SBL 51A.-1-25** from \$92,400.00 to \$110,000.00.

Project would be onsite during the well water testing. Supervisor Rieber and Director Carnell both responded to the comment. They are not sure if representatives of the firm would be present during the actual testing without consulting them to confirm. Director Carnell provided a brief explanation regarding the process of the proposed testing. Mr. Betters wanted to know if the surrounding property owners would be notified of when this testing process commences. Supervisor Rieber said he does not believe so. He said that the Developers submitted a work plan, which was reviewed by Miller Hydrogeologic Incorporated (MHI) and approved. The studies are commencing based on that approved work plan. All comments/concerns recently received regarding this matter have been provided to the developer.

Nancy McCarthy, Esq. a Hurleyville property owner asked if the responses to the proposals for Professional Planners for the Town that are being requested subject to public review or prior to selection of a Planner. Town Attorney Mednick said that he would have to review the proposal responses before a decision could be determined. He advised that if the document is permissible under (FOIL) then it would be provided. Supervisor Rieber said that new proposal(s) have been requested; however none have been received back at this time. Supervisor Rieber provided further clarification regarding this subject.


