Helen Budrock, Senior Planner of Delaware Engineering D.P.C. gave a brief overview of the proposed Kiamesha Lake WWTP Upgrades Project. She reviewed the proposed project, the schedule and the proposed sewer upgrades fact sheet, which were provided. A completed copy of the Full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) Part 1 was provided for the Town Boards review. A Lead Agency Declaration Resolution was also provided for consideration. This project is one as a result of the Infrastructure Master Plan. The Engineering Report was completed last fall. The SPDES Permit includes a schedule of compliance, which was explained. The total estimated maximum cost for the entire project would be \$27 Million Dollars. Financing options and rate increases were also discussed. A copy of a site plan is available for inspection. The Map, Plan and Report should be available in June. Mr. Robert Chiappisi of Delaware Engineering D.P.C. was also present and also commented on the (EAF). ### 2) DELAWARE ENGINEERING, DPC: EMERALD GREEN WWTP UPGRADES – BRIEF OVERVIEW OF PROJECT, REVIEW OF PROPOSED SCHEDULE AND PROPOSED SEWER UPGRADES FACT SHEET

Helen Budrock, Senior Planner of Delaware Engineering D.P.C. gave a brief overview of the proposed Emerald Green WWTP Upgrades Project. She reviewed the proposed project the schedule and the proposed sewer upgrades fact sheet, which were provided. The Preliminary Engineering Report should be completed by the end of June and then the Map, Plan and Report will be completed. The estimated maximum entire cost would be \$14 Million Dollars. Financing options were discussed. Discussion was held regarding the project and there was no action taken.

## 5) DISCUSS STATUS OF YMCA SUMMER YOUTH DAY CAMP PROGRAM

Supervisor Rieber said that he has had several discussions with Ira of the YMCA regarding operation of the camp. The Town Board had a discussion regarding whether to hold or cancel the YMCA Summer Youth Day Camp Program for this year's summer season. Many concerns and safety precautions were discussed such as social distancing issues, reduction of campers from 200 to 120 or 100 children. Supt. Somers also expressed his concerns regarding sanitizing and cleaning of the water fountain, bathrooms, door knobs and exposure to children, staff and parents/family members. Preplanning would definitely be required if the camp was to be held. Attorney Mednick expressed his legal opinion regarding a liability issue involving the campers. He said that there is increased exposure for Day Camps vs. Sleepaway Camps. No direction from the CDC at this time. After much discussion to protect the safety and welfare of the children it was decided that the Day Camp Program should be cancelled. A News Release will be prepared and posted on the Town website and Facebook page. Action to cancel the YMCA Summer Youth Day Camp Program Contract and Day Camp Program for the 2020 Summer Season was taken as follows:

## **Deputy Administrator Patrice Chester**

 Sullivan Renaissance Project Updates: 1) Received \$15,000.00 in grant funds for binder and flower dollars. Comptroller DeMarmels has the check. Supt. Somers should receive \$700.00 in flower dollars and \$300.00 to Rock Hill in flower dollars to begin those activities. 2) Preliminary Application for the Community Impact Grant was submitted today for \$400,000.00 towards improvements at the New Town Park to include a new ballfield, playground, fencing, bleachers, concession stand, bathhouse and building, which would include a first aid station and restrooms. The grant would be a matching grant in the amount of \$50,000 from the Town, \$250,000 from Assemblywoman Gunther's Office, \$100,000 from

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Sullivan Renaissance and \$50,000 from Senator Metzger's Office. The matching funds can be used on in-kind services. Both this grant if received and the Golden Feather award funds would allow for major improvements to the property. The funds have to be used on capital improvements. 3) Plans to follow up with Sullivan Renaissance to see if there is any additional funding available towards the Neversink River Property Improvements Project since the Plan and Progress Grant Program originally applied for through the County is not being funded at this time. Supervisor Rieber said that the NYS DEC might also have grant funding available. Councilwoman Meddaugh will look into other possibilities.

## Water & Sewer Superintendent Michael G. Messenger
