TOWN OF THOMPSON MARILEE J. CALHOUN TOWN CLERK Supervisor Rieber asked if the Board had any comments. The Board had no comments.

Supervisor Rieber asked if anyone from the public would like to be heard on this matter.

Glenn L. Smith, PE, Consulting Engineer on behalf of the applicant provided a brief presentation via Zoom regarding the proposed zone change request. He explained that the Emerald Green Lake Louise Marie Water Company owns a 7.8 acre parcel across from the Water Company, which abuts the former Frontier property, which is now owned by the Center for Discovery. The property where the Water Company is located is in the SR zone and the property across the street is in the HC-1 zone. The intent is to subdivide the 7.8 acre parcel into 3-lots, one would be for a new water storage tank for the Water Company, the second would be to sell 5.5 acre portion to the Center for Discovery for 4-residences and the third would be to remove an existing house on that parcel. The problem is that on the first lot the water tank is considered a public utility structure, which is not permitted in the HC-1 zone. On the second lot the Center for Discovery would like to build the 4-residences, which is considered cluster development and is not permitted in the HC-1 either. However both uses are permitted in the SR zone, which is located directly across the road, which would allow those uses.

After an opportunity for all persons to be heard Supervisor Rieber entertained a motion that the public hearing be closed.

A motion to close the Public Hearing at 7:44 PM was made by Councilman Pavese and seconded by Councilman Schock.

Supervisor Rieber opened the Public Hearing at 7:45 PM.

Town Clerk, Marilee J. Calhoun read the legal public notice and stated that she had an original affidavit of publication. Notice of said hearing was duly published in the <u>Sullivan County Democrat</u> on <u>January 22, 2021</u> with same being posted at the Town Hall and Town Website on <u>January 20, 2021</u>.

This public hearing was reconvened from 02/02/2021 regarding the repair or the demolition and or removal of unsafe building(s) located at 125 Anawana Lake Road, Monticello, NY 12701, SBL # 13.-1-13.

Supervisor Rieber reported on an email dated 02/26/21 from Mr. Daniel E. Silverman, Esq. of Silverman and Sandar LLP representing the property owner requesting an additional one month extension of this Public Hearing.

Supervisor Rieber asked if the Board had any comments. The Board had no comments.

Director Carnell said that if an extension is granted he is recommending that all unsafe buildings be boarded up and secured at this time.

Supervisor Rieber asked if anyone from the public would like to be heard on this matter. Public comments were made as follows:

Mr. Daniel Silverman, Esq. of Silverman and Sandar LLP was present on behalf of the property owner to explain reason for extension request as indicated in his email. He provided the Town Board with a status update. He advised that the snow and inclement weather has slowed the process. Further discussion was held regarding the matter.

Attorney Mednick asked Attorney Silverman if his client would be able to board up and secure the unsafe buildings within the next 30-days to allow additional time to address his concerns.

Attorney Silverman replied that he thinks they should be able to. He said that he will discuss with the Building Department to determine, which specific structures are deemed unsafe and the ones that need to be boarded and secured from public access. Attorney Silverman will contact Attorney Mednick tomorrow to discuss the matter further.

Supervisor Rieber advised that the Town Board would close the Public Hearing, but would not take any further action on the matter until after 30-days have commenced.

After an opportunity for all persons to be heard Supervisor Rieber entertained a motion that the public hearing be closed.

Local Law No. <u>04</u> of the year 2021

A local law to amend Chapter 250 of the Town of Thompson Code relating to zoning and planned unit development

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Thompson

1. Chapter 250 of the Code of the Town of Thompson entitled "Zoning and Planned Unit Development", is hereby amended to reclassify the following described real property which is currently classified on the zoning map of the Town of Thompson in the Highway Commercial-1 (HC-1) district:

Only that portion of real property identified on the Town of Thompson Tax Map as parcels Section 52, Block 1, Lots 2 and 4 consisting of approximately 7.81 acres, currently zoned as Highway Commercial-1 (HC-1), shall be reclassified on such zoning map as Suburban Residential (SR) and shall hereafter be subject to the schedule of district regulations for such Suburban Residential (SR) zone.

2. Except as herein specifically amended, the remainder of Chapter 250 of such code shall remain in full force and effect.

- 3. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and the remainder of this local law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4. Except as herein otherwise provided penalties for the violation of this local law, any person committing an offense against any provision of the chapter of the Code of the Town of Thompson shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, of such Code.
- 5. This local law shall take effect immediately.
