### 2) Bond Sale Report-\$1,817,035 in serial bonds were closed on 4/01/2020 at a net interest rate of 2.34%

Supervisor Rieber briefly reported on the bond sale totaling \$1,817,035.00 at a 2.34% interest rate. This is for Emerald Green and Kiamesha Lake Sewer Districts. Moody's Investors Service released its credit ranking for the Town of Thompson. The Town has received an Aa3 credit rating, which was helpful in securing low interest rate.

3) Adelaar Water District-Review and accept offer to settle claim for damage to a fire hydrant for the sum of \$5,000 which will net the District \$4,000 after collection fees.

### **6)** Adopt a Road- Update by Jamie Ferriero, Beautification & Adopt-A-Road Coordinator

Jamie Ferriero, Beautification and Adopt-a-Road Coordinator provided an update regarding the Adopt-a-Road Program. She reported that there have been 15 new roads adopted this year within the Town outside of the Village. She said that 9 were adopted by business and 6 were adopted by individuals. She has been focusing solely on the Town at this time and will contact the Village to discuss future program participation in the Village as well. The roadside litter pluck program was also discussed. There are organized events scheduled throughout the Town as follows: RH area-04/24, DeHoyos Park area-04/25 and Hamilton Road area-05/01. Information on these events will be posted on the Towns website as they become available. Litter pluck bags will be available in the front vestibule of the Town Hall along with bag stickers.
