

Annual Water Quality Report Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. Town of Thompson ID No: 5203344

Drinking water provided for public use may originate from several sources including rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals, and may also pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals, or from human activity. All of these materials are generally considered contaminants, and may be classified as microbes, pesticides and herbicides, radioactive, inorganic or organic chemicals.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. water supply, which consists of approximately four hundred and ten service connections, originates from one source; the plant drilled well about one hundred fifty feet deep. A second drilled well is located near Frazer Road, but has not been in use. The Kiamesha Lake surface water source is no longer in use.

The New York State Department of Health has completed a source water assessment for this water system, based on available information. Possible and actual threats to this drinking water source were evaluated. The state source water assessment includes a susceptibility rating based on the risk posed by each potential source of contamination and how easily contaminants can move through the subsurface to the wells. The susceptibility rating is an estimate of the potential for contamination of the source water, it does not mean that the water delivered to consumers is, or will be, contaminated. The purpose of source water assessments is to provide resource managers with additional information for protecting source waters in the future.

As mentioned previously in this report, our drinking water is derived from one drilled well. The source water assessment has rated this well as having a medium high to high susceptibility to enteric bacteria, halogenated solvents, herbicides/pesticides, metals, nitrates, petroleum products, and other industrial organics. These ratings are due primarily to the close proximity of permitted discharge facilities (industrial/commercial facilities that discharge wastewater into the environment and are regulated by the State and/or Federal government) and a high intensity commercial zone in relation to the well. In addition the well draws from an unconfined aquifer of unknown hydraulic conductivity and chemical contamination has been documented. Please note that this report only details the possibility for contamination. Our water is tested regularly to ensure that the finished water coming into your home meets New York State drinking water standards.

County and state health departments will use this information to direct future source water protection activities. These may include water quality monitoring, resource management, planning, and education programs. A copy of the assessment, including a map of the assessment area can be obtained by contacting us as noted below.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the Environmental Protection Agency prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Likewise, the Food and Drug Administration establishes limits for contaminants in bottled water, providing the same protection for public health. State regulations further establish maximum contaminant levels (MCL), as well as minimum monitoring or testing requirements, depending on each contaminant. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. It should be noted that the presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk.

Dependent on regulations and/or test results of analyses conducted, public water supplies may be treated by processes of filtration, disinfection, or treatment additives prior to delivery to customers.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. drilled well is treated by a chlorination system to ensure bacteriologically safe, potable water.

Some people may be more vulnerable to disease causing microorganisms or pathogens in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants may be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice from their health care providers.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. routinely undergoes analyses for nitrates, inorganics, volatile organics, synthetic organics and bacteriological quality. Testing of the water system for compliance with the New York State Department of Health regulations has been completed for 2021 and copies of the results have been submitted to the regulatory agency in a timely manner. Test results of contaminants monitored prior to 2021 may be obtained by contacting your representative, Allan Schachnovsky (845)794-4265, or the New York State Department of Health (845)794-2045.

The following table outlines which contaminants were detected in your drinking water. The State allows the monitoring for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. Therefore some of the data, though representative of the water quality, is more than one year old.

Column C is the percentage change in the estimate of full value between the 2021 State equalization rate and the 2022 State equalization rate due to the change in full value standard.

This percentage change is important because county and school taxes are apportioned according to a municipality's share of the full value of the county or the school. A municipality will be apportioned a larger share of the tax levy if its full value increases by a larger percentage than others, or if its full value decreases less than the decrease for other municipalities in the county or school.

The information shown in columns B and C is subject to change as other rates are established in the county. You will be sent a complete report when we have established 2022 State equalization rates for all municipalities in your county.







# PART I ENGINEER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

CLIENT wishes to update its Comprehensive Plan, which was last revised in 1999, and is seeking support, guidance and assistance from ENGINEER. CLIENT intends the updated Comprehensive Plan to act as a guide for future development, a framework for updating public policies and land use regulations, and a plan for future capital improvements and investments in public facilities and infrastructure. ENGINEER shall utilize professional planners, GIS specialists, environmental scientists, and engineers in conducting the following tasks:

#### 1. GIS Mapping & Data Compilation

Delaware Engineering will review existing plans and documents, and compile needed data to form a basis on which to enhance the Comprehensive Plan. This includes an investigation of historic development patterns throughout the Town as well as data gathering in the Building Department records and other sources. Delaware Engineering will provide GIS mapping of existing conditions, as well as updated demographic and economic data available through the US Census Bureau and other sources. The update will include an evaluation of the goals and strategies contained in the prior comprehensive plan to determine if they reflect current realities.

#### 2. Steering Committee Meetings

Delaware Engineering will attend and present at monthly meetings of a Comprehensive Plan committee, and guide the committee through the planning process. Each month would cover a different topic and would involve a facilitated discussion to identify current issues and opportunities, and to develop a series of goals and objectives related to the topic at hand (using the current comp plan as a starting point). A written summary would be provided following each meeting for later use in drafting the plan.

#### 3. Public Participation

Delaware Engineering will create a web site for the project, and develop, launch and tabulate the results of an on-line survey to help guide the comprehensive planning process. The Town will be provided with the raw data, as well as a summary of survey responses in graphic form using charts and infographics. Delaware will also organize, publicize and facilitate one or more public meetings, visioning workshops and/or open houses to solicit public input (format/structure to be determined in consultation with the Comprehensive Plan Committee).

#### 5. Draft Plan Preparation

Delaware Engineering will prepare and deliver a completed draft of the updated comprehensive plan for review by the comprehensive review committee, Town Board, and Planning Board. Delaware Engineering will also revise the plan for final submission, incorporating feedback and comments from the public, County Planning, Town Board, Village Board, Planning Board, etc.

At a minimum, the plan will cover the following topic areas and include an analysis of existing conditions and identification of town-wide issues and opportunities within each topic:

- Population & Housing
- Economic Development
- Transportation & Utilities
- Community Facilities & Services
- Open Space & Natural Resources
- Planning & Future Land Use

Following the format of the current Comprehensive Plan, the updated document will also include a chapter with specific recommendations for areas of local importance within the Town including:

- Kiamesha Lake Commercial Corridor
- Old Route 17 Corridor
- Rock Hill Hamlet & Lake Communities
- Monticello Village Gateways

Finally, the draft plan will include a separate "Implementation Plan" with clearly articulated goals and objectives to guide future growth and development in the Town and its hamlets, as well as specific action items to be implemented in the next 3 to 5 years.

#### 6. SEQR Compliance & Plan Adoption

Delaware Engineering will prepare a Long Form Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) for use by the Town Board to make a declaration of significance on whether the adoption of the Updated Comprehensive Plan will have an impact on the environment. It is anticipated that a negative declaration will be issued. In the event a positive declaration is issued, preparation of a Generic Environmental Impact Statement would be outside this scope of services and would be performed for an additional fee.

Delaware Engineering will also provide all necessary materials for the Town Board to make a motion on the adoption of the final updated Comprehensive Plan.

# PART II COMPENSATION, BILLING AND SCHEDULE

Delaware Engineering will conduct the Scope of Services identified in Part I on a time and materials basis with a not to exceed cap of \$80,000. Monthly invoices will be sent with notes indicating the time spent on each task and the remaining budget.

In no event and under no circumstances shall engineer be liable to client for consequential, incidental, indirect, special, or punitive damages.

- 13. ACCESS. CLIENT shall provide ENGINEER safe access to any premises necessary for ENGINEER to provide the Services.
- 14. REUSE OF PROJECT DELIVERABLES. Reuse of any documents or other deliverables, including electronic media, pertaining to the Project by CLIENT for any purpose other than that for which such documents or deliverables were originally prepared, or alteration of such documents or deliverables were originally prepared, or alteration of such documents or deliverables without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended, shall be at the CLIENT'S risk. Further, all title blocks and the engineer's seal, if applicable, shall be removed if and when CLIENT provides deliverables in electronic media to another entity. 

The ability to conduct meetings online has become commonplace over the last couple of years as the pandemic has changed the way we communicate. Even with restrictions subsiding, the remote experience is has become a permanent fixture that people expect to have as an option.

To facilitate this, we will install a combination of cameras, microphones and video equipment that will allow users to connect to common UC software applications like Zoom or Microsoft Teams with ease.

Two (2) High-Definition PTZ cameras will be ceiling mounted to provide optimal coverage for various types of meetings. They feature decent low light performance, 20X zoom, will be white in color, and will be controlled with a combination of presets and pan-tilt-zoom controls on a touch screen.

Up to six wireless microphones will be available for use. Four (4) tabletop style mics are intended for Town Board, Planning, and Zoning meetings. Additionally, two (2) hand-held style microphones are available for use with a mic stand or podium mount. The microphones will recharge on the included charging base after each use. Each charge is good for at least 8 hours of continuous use.

Microphones will reinforce into the room so all attendees can hear and will transmit to your online participants as well. Audio will be played back through eight (8) new ceiling speakers of higher quality.

For sharing video content within the room, two (2) new commercial grade 4K displays will replace the current ones mounted to the articulating arms. The articulating arms will be reused to allow the displays to be orientated as needed. The displays feature robust build quality for years of use. A wall mounted HDMI input will be available for meeting content from a connected laptop. Additionally, users will be capable of connecting their laptop without cables to the AV system using a new secure wireless presentation appliance connected to your network.

To enhance Town Court sessions, two (2) new microphone jacks will be installed near the Judge's bench. 

- 5. **WAIVER OF LIABILITY:** The Funding Recipient shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees, and agents, against and from any and all losses, claims, actions, damages, expenses or liabilities, including reasonable attorneys' fees, as a result of a negligent act, omission or willful misconduct of the Funding Recipient, its employees, representatives, agents, subcontractors or assigns.
- 6. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: The Funding Recipient agrees that its relationship to the County is that of an independent contractor and that neither it nor its employees or agents will hold themselves out as, nor claim to be, officers or employees of the County, or of any department, agency or unit thereof, and they will not make any claim, demand or application to or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of the County, including, but not limited to, Worker's Compensation coverage, health coverage, Unemployment Insurance Benefits, Social Security coverage or employee retirement membership or credit. The Funding Recipient shall not act as agent, or be an agent, of the County. As an independent contractor, the Funding Recipient shall be solely responsible for determining the means and methods of performing the services and shall have complete charge and responsibility for the Funding Recipient's personnel engaged in the performance of the services. However, if any personnel of the Funding Recipient act in a manner that is detrimental to the County, the County may require the Funding Recipient to remove or replace such personnel with respect to the performance of services required.

- 7. **TERMINATION**: The County may, by written notice to the Funding Recipient effective upon mailing, terminate this Agreement at any time upon the Funding Recipient's default.
- 8. MODIFICATION: This Agreement may be modified only by a writing signed by both parties.
- 9. **AUTHORIZATION**: This Agreement is authorized by Resolution No. 129-22, adopted by the Sullivan County Legislature on April 7, 2022.
