If any section, part or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person, property or circumstance is adjudged invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, part or application directly and expressly adjudged invalid and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law or the application thereof.

5. Except as herein otherwise provided penalties for the violation of this local law, any person committing an offense against any provision of the Chapter of the Code of the Town of Thompson shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, of such Code.
