NOTIFICATION OF OTHER PERMITTEE OBLIGATIONS

P/C/I SPDES- GROUNDWATER DISCHARGE PERMIT CONDITIONS

- 1. Request for General Permit Authorization Prior to the use of this General Permit for modification, construction and operation of the discharge point(s) at a facility, an applicant must submit the following information to the NYSDEC Regional Permit Administrator:
 - Application for State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) General Permit GP-0-15-001.
 - Engineering design and site plan signed and stamped by a Professional Engineer licensed to practice in New York State. One printed copy and one electronic copy (PDF format) of the engineering design and site plan shall be submitted to the Department.
 - A Design Certification of On-Site Treatment Works signed and stamped by the Professional Engineer certifying that the wastewater treatment system is designed in accordance with the Design Standards referenced in the "General Permit Authorized Activity" section of this permit.



2. Department-validated General Permit Authorization Upon review of the project, the Department will determine if the project can be authorized under this General Permit. No work may proceed prior to receipt of the Department-validated General Permit.

The Department-validated General Permit will authorize the specific outfall (i.e., type of on-site treatment system and design flow) described in the Application, Design Certification of On-Site Treatment Works, and site plan.

Following receipt of the Department-validated General Permit, the permittee may proceed with construction of the on-site treatment system.

- 3. Approval to Discharge Wastewater discharge from the system authorized by the Department-validated General Permit is approved when the following appropriate action is taken:
 - At the completion of facility construction and prior to commencing a discharge, the permittee must submit a Post Construction Certification of On-site Treatment Works form, signed by a professional engineer certifying that the treatment system has been constructed in accordance with the originally approved engineering design and site plan, to the Department's NYSDEC GP-0-15-001 Coordinator. The certification must include the date that the treatment system will be placed into service and become operational.
 - If modifications were made to the originally approved engineering design and site plan, the permittee must submit electronic as-built site plan (PDF and CAD format) noting any deviation from the originally approved site plan to the Department's NYSDEC GP-0-15-001 Coordinator.

For conversion of a facility that has been constructed and is operating in accordance with an individual SPDES permit to this General Permit, the Application for General Permit does not need the above-described certifications and as-built plans, unless requested by the Department.

- 4. Maximum Flow, Strength and Character The treatment system must not receive, or be committed to receive, sanitary wastes without the admixture of industrial wastes that:
 - a. exceed the treatment system design flow, or
 - b. have a strength or characteristic beyond the design capability of the treatment system.
- 5. Inspect Septic Tanks A septic tank installed as part of the treatment system shall be inspected by the permittee or his agent for scum and sludge accumulation at intervals not to exceed one year's duration. The permittee shall remove scum and sludge accumulations before the depth of either exceeds one-fourth of the liquid depth so that no settleable solids or scum will leave in the septic tank effluent. Septage materials shall be removed, transported and disposed of in accordance with applicable law and regulation.

Such inspections may be performed by the permittee, an engineer licensed to practice in New York State, a National Association of Wastewater Transporters (NAWT)-certified inspector, or a New York Onsite Wastewater Treatment Training Network (OTN)-registered inspector. Records of annual septic tank inspection and pumping information shall be retained onsite and maintained for five years for review by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.



- 6. Maintain Facility The permittee must maintain the treatment system in effective working condition.

- 5. Engineer's Report letter stated that a Flow Confirmation letter would be forwarded to our offices once received by the applicant. Please provide this letter.

If this system is being reviewed and approved by DOH, then a stamped Engineer's Report and the stamped "Design Certification of On-site Treatment Works" form will be sufficient for DEC. If DOH is not doing system review and approval, additional technical review by DEC staff will be required and additional information may be requested. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC or Department) received the above resubmission for permits pursuant to Article 17, State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES), Article 24, Freshwater Wetlands, and a Water Quality Certification pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act that you submitted on behalf of 218 Hilltop LLC. A Notice of Incomplete Application (NOIA) was sent on February 28, 2024. As per NYCRR Part 621.6(e), applications will remain incomplete until all requested items are received by the Department. A partial submission of requested material does not change the incomplete status. Your resubmittal was missing some of the information requested in that NOIA. Therefore, yours is a partial resubmission and the application remains incomplete.

Water Withdrawal

Based upon the revised April 23, 2024 report titled, *Engineer's Report For Proposed Sewer Outfall 002 For Yeshiva Ohr Yoseph*, the development is currently served by an existing system with two wells with stabilized pumping rates of 17.0 gallons per minute (gpm) and 34.2 gpm. The March 6, 2023 letter from your office indicates a second proposed water system with two additional wells and a total withdrawal capacity of approximately 80,000 gallons per day (gpd). If all four wells are to be used to serve the same facility, are operated under a single Legally Responsible Person/Party, and are located on the same property tax parcel, withdrawal capacity will account for a combined capacity including both systems. Title 5 of Article 15 of the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) requires the DEC to issue a water withdrawal permit for water withdrawals of 100,000 gallons or more per day, including any facility that has the *capacity* to withdraw 100,000 gpd of water or more. Activities exempt from the permit requirements are listed under 6 NYCRR 601.9.

Capacity is the maximum potential withdrawal of all the water sources for a facility. DEC requires a permit for water withdrawal system having the maximum capacity to withdraw 100,000 gpd or more of surface water or groundwater. The permitting threshold is therefore based on a system capacity exceeding 100,000 gpd rather than volume withdrawn.

According to Title 15, Article 15 of the ECL, no person who is engaged in, or proposing to engage in, the operation of a water withdrawal system with a capacity of greater than or equal to the threshold volume, shall have any power to do the following until such person has first obtained a permit or permit modification from the department pursuant to this title:

- a) To make a water withdrawal from an existing or new source or an increased water withdrawal from an existing permitted source;
- To take or condemn lands for the protection of any existing sources of public water supply; or for the development or protection of any new or additional sources of public water supply;
- c) To commence or undertake the construction of any works or projects in connection with the proposed withdrawal; or
- d) To extend its supply or distribution mains into any new water service area or extension that has not been approved by the department or a predecessor commission;
- e) To make a significant change in the principal use of the water withdrawal system from that specified in the permit, or permit application.

Furthermore, withdrawals of water which have received an approval from the Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC) are specifically exempt from requiring a DEC permit. Community Risk and Resiliency Act (CRRA)

The previous NOIA requested an additional narrative discussion demonstrating that it meets the requirements of the Community Risk and Resiliency Act (CRRA). The applicant indicated that a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) was prepared, which contained a hydrological analysis and comparison of pre- and post-development stormwater runoff conditions. The SWPPP does not specifically address increased storm intensity or potential for increased flooding, therefore it does not satisfy the requirements of CRRA. Please provide a brief narrative describing how this project is considerate of climate-related risks for this area. The attached form can be used as a guide and supplement for the narrative.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (Department or DEC) has reviewed the application submitted for the above referenced project, located at Maplewood Garden Road and Route 17B. According to the application materials, received on July 5, 2024, the proposal consists of building an access road and drilling test wells for the purposes of a future development. This action will create disturbances to the 100-foot adjacent area of NYS Freshwater Wetland MO-48, Class 4.

Based on our review of the submitted materials, Department staff have determined that the application is incomplete. Please submit the following items for the Department to continue its review:

Public records show the landowner is listed as Dorothy Schmidt Rev Trust. Please provide appropriate signatures for the landowner or if the property was recently purchased, please provide documentation, redacting any sensitive information.

ARTICLE 24 FRESHWATER WETLANDS

In order to meet permit issuance standards, 6 NYCRR Part 663 requires that disturbance to the wetland and its 100-foot adjacent area first be avoided, then minimized to the maximum practicable extent possible. Can the test wells be moved to locations outside the 100-foot adjacent area? If the test wells and access roads did not

These exemptions would eliminate the County's review and comment on local actions of strictly local concern. Examples of such exemptions include:

- ADA compliance improvements and area variances
- Residential use on second floors of structures with ground-floor commercial use

GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW SECTION 239 REFERRAL EXEMPTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF SULLIVAN AND TOWN OF THOMPSON

AGREEMENT made as of the 16th day of May, 2024, consists of the following terms and conditions:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law Sections 239-l, m and n (GML 239) require that certain planning and zoning actions be referred to the Sullivan County Division of Planning before any action is taken by the municipality having jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the General Municipal Law Section 239 further requires the County to assess all such implications as to whether the requested action would have a "countywide" or "inter-community" impact and to comment on same; and

WHEREAS, the current referral process results in the ongoing processing and review of applications from Sullivan County's 21 municipalities, a portion of which have neither countywide or inter-community impact: and

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law, Section 239-m-3-c, authorizes the County to enter into agreements with local municipalities in order to exempt actions deemed to be of strictly local concern from mandatory referral; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to improve governmental efficiency, Sullivan County and the Town of Thompson propose to eliminate the necessity of the County's review and comment on such local actions; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. **PARTIES**: This Agreement is by and between the County of Sullivan, a municipal corporation of the State of New York with its offices at the Sullivan County Government Center, 100 North Street, Monticello, New York 12701, hereinafter, designated as "County" and the Town of Thompson with an address of 4052 State Route 42, Monticello, NY 12701, hereinafter designated as "Municipality".
- 2. **TERM OF AGREEMENT**: This Agreement shall supersede and replace all prior agreements between Sullivan County and the Municipality. This Agreement shall be effective May 16th, 2024 through May 15th, 2025 unless otherwise terminated as set forth herein. This Agreement shall renew annually, for up to four (4) additional years commencing on May 16th of any year and terminating on May 15th of the following year, unless either party provides written notice to the other at least thirty (30) days before the end of any term.
- 3. **EXEMPTIONS**: The actions attached in Schedule A shall be eliminated from the General Municipal Law Section 239 referral and review process, pursuant to County Resolution No. 257-24
- 4. **REFERRALS NOT TO BE ELIMINATED**: The following actions shall not be eliminated from the referral and review process:

- a) Land use plans including comprehensive plans, master plans, and neighborhood, district or corridor plans;
- b) Amendments to the municipal zoning code or zoning district map;
- c) Other proposed local laws and/or authorizations adopted pursuant to zoning (wetlands, historic preservation, affordable housing, moratoria, etc.);
- d) Site plan review, except for the exemptions detailed in item 3 above;
- e) any action that constitutes a Type 1 action under SEQRA;
- f) Special permits, use variances, and area variances for all non-residential uses and multifamily developments; and
- g) Projects triggered by proximity to a State designated Agriculture District.
- 5. **REVIEW REQUEST**: The Sullivan County Division of Planning reserves the right to request a review and recommendation on any of the aforementioned exempt actions, if in their opinion such review and recommendation are warranted due to the specific circumstances of the requested action.
- 6. **TERMINATION**: Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty days prior written notice to the other.
- 7. **MODIFICATION**: This Agreement may be modified only by a writing signed by both parties.
- 8. **AUTHORIZATION**: This Agreement is authorized by Resolution No. 257-24, adopted by the Sullivan County Legislature on May 16th, 2024.


